The National Alliance for Insurance Education and Research

The Certified Risk Manager (CRM) designation requires five courses to be successfully completed. IRM 3305 and IRM 4308 allow students to complete three of the five required courses (Principles of Risk Management, Control of Risk and Practice of Risk Management). The IRM courses were developed in cooperation and collaboration with The National Alliance (TNA) in order to provide custom-designed courses that achieve UHD learning objectives and TNA's collegiate program requirements for the University Associate Certified Risk Manager (UACRM) designation.

IRM 3305: At the beginning of the semester, the professor will provide the students with a link to the TNA website for the students to register for the Principles and Control courses and pay a \$100 fee. This fee covers the course materials and national exam which is written and graded by TNA. The student must forward a copy of the registration confirmation to the professor who will then provide access to the online course materials. Students must receive a passing grade on the national Principles exam to earn credit for the CRM Principles course and earn at least a C as a final grade on the IRM course to receive credit for the CRM Control course. Those who successfully complete these two requirements will earn the University Associate Certified Risk Management (UACRM) designation.

IRM 4308: At the beginning of the semester, the professor will provide the students with a link to the TNA website for them to register for the CRM Practice course and pay a \$100 fee. This fee covers the course materials and national exam which is written and graded by TNA. The student must forward a copy of the registration confirmation to the professor who will then provide access to the online course materials. Students must receive a passing grade on the national CRM Practice exam and earn at least a C as a final grade on the IRM course to receive credit for the CRM Practice course.

After the student passes the CRM Principles and Practice national exams and the IRM 3305 and IRM 4308 courses, the student will have earned credit for three of the five required courses of the Certified Risk Manager (CRM) designation. The remaining two courses, i.e. Financing of Risk and Analysis of Risk, must be taken through TNA to achieve the CRM designation.
