



### Requirements for Formal Admission into the Teacher Education Program

- A minimum 2.5 overall grade point average
- 30 semester credit hours (SCH) of course work
- Obtain passing scores on one of the following: TASP/THEA, TSI Assessment, ACT (in the past 5 years), SAT (in the past 5 years), TAKS (in the past 5 years), STAAR EOC English Level II and Algebra Level 2 (in past five years), Associate's or Bachelor's degree, or see an advisor for additional possibilities for Military Service or previous college requirements.
- Be in good standing
- Complete all developmental courses, if required
- Successful completion of ENG 1301 and 1302, MATH 1301 (with a grade of "C" or better)
- Successful completion of Life and Physical Sciences and American History component (with a grade of "C" or better)
- Declare major (online or with CPS Advising).
- Formal application to the program

### General Education Common Core (42 Hours)

- Component Area Option: New Student Seminar\* (UHD 1301, 1302, 1303, 1304, 1305, 1306, 1307, 1308, 2301, 2302, 2303, 2304, 2305, 2306, 2307, 2308) Must select one

\*In the first semester of attendance at UHD, a student will take either a course numbered UHD 1301-1308 or a course numbered UHD 2301-2308. UHD 1301-1308 is intended for students who have: not completed the six hours of the Component Area Option requirement at a Texas college or university or; earned fewer than 30 SCHs of college work or; have not passed ENG 1301, regardless of the number of SCHs earned. UHD 2301-2308 is intended for students who have: not completed the six hours of the Component Area Option requirement at a Texas college or university or; earned at least 30 SCHs of college work or; passed ENG 1301.

## Professional Development Semesters (33 hours)

It is the expectation of the Urban Education program that teacher candidates will have passed at least two of the required state certification exams prior to Professional Development III (student teaching). Testing approval will be given as follows upon successful completion of –

- Professional Development I (PD1): EC-12 Professional Roles and Responsibilities exam and ESL Supplemental Exam (Exams are \$131 each)
- Professional Development II (PD2): Core Subjects EC-6 Exam (Exam is \$131)
- Professional Development III (PD3): All Testing Completed

In order to successfully complete each professional development semester, students must demonstrate mastery of content, this it is *highly recommended* that *preparatory and academic courses be taken before beginning the professional development semesters*. Admission to the professional development semesters is approved by the advisor/coordinator of the Urban Education Department. As state guidelines change, continual program revisions may occur. Teacher education programs are developed in response to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) regulations and guidelines. Thus, course requirements and sequencing are subject to change. All students pursuing teacher certification plans must understand that the advising staff will make every effort to communicate program changes as they occur, but it is the responsibility of each student to stay apprised of any changes that may affect degree plans. Thus constant monitoring of plans is necessary, and *students are urged to visit regularly with an academic advisor*.
