**Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT)
With Area of Expertise in History**

The Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) with Area of Expertise in History is designed to prepare students to teach high school history, dual credit high school/college history and university-level history courses. Students take six courses in the History Department and six courses in the Department of Urban Education. The courses in this program are taught utilizing a combination of face-to-face, online, and hybrid instruction.

Learning Outcomes

1. Demonstrate competency in critical thinking and problem solving.
2. Recount major historical works and historiographical debates in at least two content areas.
3. Generate explanations of the causes and consequences of historical events and place events into their proper historical context, based on their analysis of primary and secondary sources.
4. Collect and organize both primary and secondary sources using both electronic and print materials.
5. Write clear and convincing essays, including formal research papers that follow standard academic convention within the field of history.
6. Implement effective teaching practices that enhance student achievement for all students.

How to Apply and Admission Requirements

- Minimum GPA of 2.5 (Note: Applicants with a GPA of 3.0 or higher are exempt from the GRE requirement)
- Official transcript which depicts an earned baccalaureate degree from an accredited university and any graduate credit earned (Note: Applicants with 10 or more years since enrollment and/or since earning an undergraduate degree are required to take and submit GRE scores)
- GRE scores (Quantitative and Verbal combined: 150 or higher, and Analytical Writing: 4 or higher)
- 3 professional recommendation letters
- Written personal statement (**250 words minimum**) about your desire to pursue a MAT in History
- Earned required number of points based on the MAT admission multiple criteria index
- Submitted TOEFL scores (if applicable)
- Submit a history research paper of approximately 2,000 words in length. This writing sample should demonstrate the candidate's competency in both writing and historical research.
- Application Due: August 5th for Fall; January 10th for Spring

The MAT degree program requires completion of a minimum of 36 semester credit hours. For degree completion, at least 30 hours must be completed at UH-Downtown with a grade point average of 3.0. In addition, students must successfully complete a directed studies project (MAT 6390) with approval of the MAT in History mentor and under the supervision of an appointed faculty advisor. This master's degree does not include initial Texas Teacher Certification.

Total MAT Tuition/Fees (12 classes)

\$13,908 (Texas resident, based on Fall 2016 tuition/fees, taking two classes per semester)

Note: Tuition prices can change, and taking fewer than two classes per semester will raise the total program price of tuition/fees. This program cost estimate does not include books, materials, and living expenses. Tuition for non-Texas residents and international students is higher.
