



**Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) with Core Subjects EC-6
and ESL Supplemental Certification**

The Master of Teaching (MAT) degree with Core Subjects EC-6 and ESL Supplemental Certification prepares and certifies graduates for self-contained and subject specific teaching positions in Texas elementary schools. The program also trains and certifies graduates to teach English as a Second Language (ESL) students in both mainstream and ESL self-contained elementary classrooms. Furthermore, the program prepares graduates to assume educational leadership and teacher training roles in a variety of educational settings.

Note: Students may start this program in the fall semester only. The courses in this degree plan are taught using a hybrid of face-to-face and online instruction. Program participants must complete a semester of student teaching, pass the TExES PPR, Core Subjects EC-6, and ESL Supplemental Tests, and graduate with a master's degree to earn Texas Educator Certification.

The MAT degree program requires completion of a minimum of 36 semester credit-hours. For degree completion, at least 30 credit-hours must be completed at UH-Downtown with a grade point average of 3.0. In addition, students must successfully complete a directed studies project (MAT 6390) under the supervision of an appointed faculty advisor.

All UHD MAT students are encouraged to apply for the Gordon and Mary Cain Graduate Academic Merit Scholarship. This scholarship will pay for half the price of UHD MAT tuition/fees. Students can earn this scholarship more than once during the course of their MAT program.
