

Supply chain management involves changing products from raw materials into finished goods that reach the customer, and includes planning and forecasting; purchasing; product assembly; moving; and storage.

Every year more than \$1.5 trillion of materials are purchased by manufacturing firms alone. Federal, state and local governments purchase another \$1 trillion of goods and services each year. In Houston and across the world, supply chain management plays an integral role in the economy. In the private sector, every dollar saved by improved purchasing and supply management adds another dollar to profit. In the public sector, every dollar saved by a government purchasing practice represents either a dollar available for another project or for tax reductions.

About the Program

The Bachelor of Business Administration in Supply Chain Management (SCM) within the Marilyn Davies College of Business, is a 120-hour-credit program comprised of 42 hours of Preparatory Requirements, 48 hours of Business Core Requirements, and 24 hours of SCM Major Requirements.

The SCM BBA is frequently updated in consultation with industry experts. The SCM degree program is driven by a real-world curriculum, which is made possible by the mutually beneficial working relationships between the Marilyn Davies College of Business and local business and philanthropic communities.

A major in SCM, combined with a minor in an area such as MIS, marketing or project management, provides students with a sound understanding of supply chain management and strategy, plus specialized skills and knowledge in the minor area to increase their value to hiring managers.
