Earning Potential

The average starting salary for teachers in Greater Houston is about **\$61,000** for a nine-month contract (retirement and medical benefits included). Graduates with Bilingual, ESL, STEM-related, or SPED certification may receive additional stipends. In-service teachers are eligible for loan forgiveness if they teach five or more years in a Title I school.

The BA in Education prepares candidates to earn a degree and teacher certification in EC-6 ESL, EC-6 Bilingual, 4-8 ESL, or Special Education. High school certification in Math, History, Science or Social Studies is offered as well. Candidates engage in field-based coursework and complete a yearlong student teaching experience in preparation for a successful career in education. Our diverse communities require highly qualified teachers who represent our student population to provide dynamic, equitable educational experiences for all school children.

- Program is offered at three campuses with day and evening options, providing flexibility to navigate degree completion, family, and work responsibilities.
- Graduates from UHD's Department of Urban Education have an 88% five-year retention rate—higher than the state and national average.
- Alternate field experience/student teaching options are available for paraprofessionals who qualify.

UHD's proficiency-driven, field-based educator preparation program focuses on providing candidates with diverse experience in city and suburban Title I schools. Through engaging, hands-on, in-class interactions and field-based experiences, teacher candidates finish our program prepared to enter today's EC-12 classrooms and appropriately meet students' needs.

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Affiliated Student Organizations


