General Classroom Safety Tips

- Become familiar with areas surrounding your classroom and office.
- Locate two stairwells close to your classroom and office to be used during an evacuation.
- Plan how you and your students will exit the building in an emergency.
- Report suspicious behavior to police.
- Know the location of safety features near your classroom, such as a fire extinguisher or call-box.
- Keep your classroom door closed at all times. Propping the door open will hinder security.
- Be sure to take all your valuables when leaving the classroom, even for a short time.
- Do not leave keys, electronic access devices, or unlocked computers unattended.
- Immediately report any maintenance deficiencies that may compromise safety or security.
- Report all suspicious activity, injury, or hazard to UHD Police as soon as possible.
- Enforce all applicable safety practices and procedures developed by your department and Environmental Health and Safety.

Classroom Lockdown System

The Classroom Lockdown System provide uses electronic access to instructors with the means to immediately lock all entrances to classroom without moving the far teaching podium. The from the classroom system uses а activation pushbutton for and an LED light to indicate status.

Located within a few feet of the podium is a **YELLOW/RED** pushbutton mounted on the wall. Room status is indicated by an LED light mounted to the ceiling.



When the **RED** pushbutton pressed, the door's electronic lock will go into "locked" mode and cannot be opened via a hallway card or fob. An audible alarm is sounded in UHD Police Dispatch and a message is dis-played on the dispatcher's screen indicating the specific room that triggered the lock-down action. Police officers will be immedi-ately dispatched to the room/area with the expectation indicated that a serious situation is unfolding. No entry can be made from the unless UHD hallwav Police Dispatch remotely overrides control system or a metal building key is used to gain entry. Occupants of the room can always exit.- at no point will they be locked in.

Electronically accessed rooms can also be placed in lockdown mode immediately by UHD Police Dispatch. An individual room, entire floor or building can be locked down.

Classrooms installed with the lockdown system will have an LED light mounted to the ceiling indicating status as described below:

- Room is unoccupied and locked the LED light is off
- Room is unlocked, occupied and operating normal - LED light is GREEN
- Room has been placed in lockdown mode by police or by instructor - LED light is RED





If an instructor sees the LED light change from GREEN to RED, the instructor should assume that a broader lockdown is in pro-gress. Pushing the RED button after a broader lockdown is in progress will not impact door security.

NOTICE: To be effective, the door must be completely closed.
